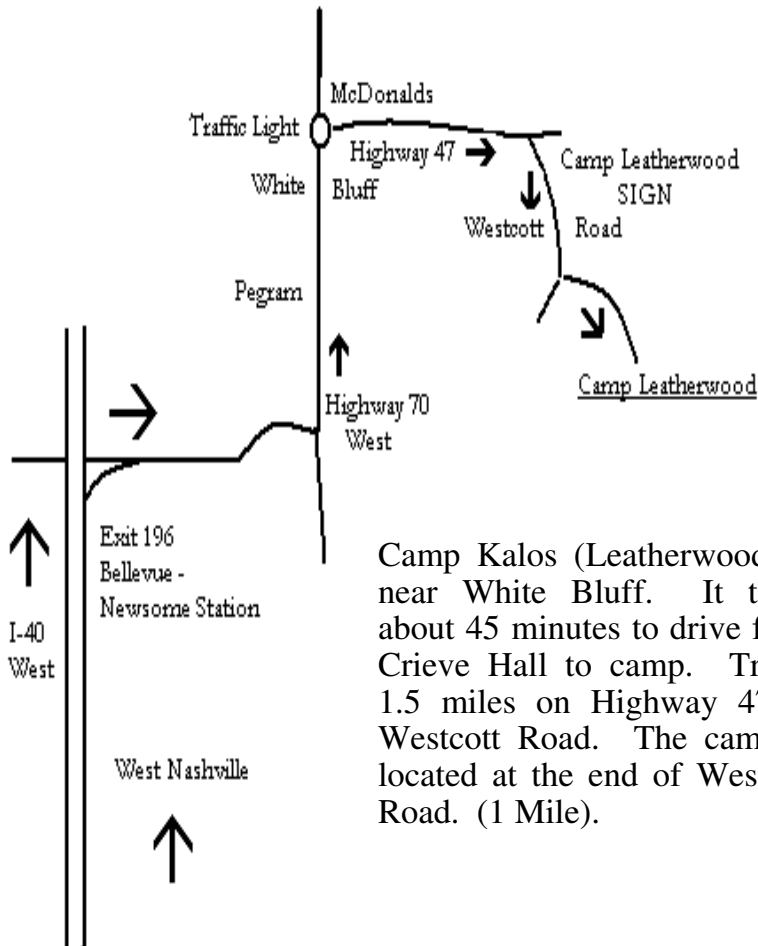


MAP TO CAMP KALOS

MESSAGE TO PARENTS: It is the desire of the staff of Camp Kalos that camp week be a profitable experience for your child physically, emotionally, and most of all, spiritually. Although the camp will provide many activities, the primary purpose will be to encourage a closer relationship with God through Bible classes, daily devotionals, and Christian fellowship. Please examine the information concerning camp guidelines and how to pack. Go over the rules with your child and send clothing and gear in keeping with the guidelines.

Eligibility: Campers need to be between the ages of 9 and 17, or entering the 4th grade and completing the 11th grade. Friends of Crieve Hall youth may go if room is available.

Cost: The fee is \$100⁰⁰ for the first camper in a family, and \$85⁰⁰ for each additional camper from the same family.

Visitors: We welcome visitors but cannot accommodate overnight guests. The meals are prepared for campers and staff. Visitors are asked to eat before arriving at camp.

Start and Finish: Campers should plan to arrive between the hours of 3:00 p.m. & 5:00 p.m. on July 17. Please register in the dining hall first. Camp ends at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, July 22.

Theme: "In Christ Alone"

At Camp Kalos this year we will follow the theme of "In Christ Alone". The benefits that a life in Christ affords are numerous after looking at Scripture. The Bible teaches that Christ is our Foundation and our Rock for the things we will face in this life. The book of Ephesians, especially in chapters 1 & 2, talks a lot about the spiritual blessings of a life in Christ. In our evening devotionals we will dissect the song "In Christ Alone" and explore different ideas of the identity of Christ and what he means to us as Christians. In our Bible classes we will study what a life in Christ actually looks like and how to walk daily with Jesus!

WHAT DOES KALOS MEAN?

Kalos is the Greek word for good or beautiful. We look forward to a beautiful week with good people in God's wonderful Creation.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP:

1. Paper Bible, not a phone Bible
2. Bedding: a sleeping bag or two twin sheets and blanket, pillow.
3. **Clothing: check camp rules for clothing guidelines. Bring enough clothing for the week: socks, underwear, long shorts, jeans, t-shirts. Bring clothes & props for "The Happiest Place in the World" on Thursday night with anything Disney attire.**
4. A raincoat, a jacket and sweatshirt.
5. Modest swimsuit/cover-up for going to and from pool.
6. Shower clogs (flip flops).
7. Bath items: towels, comb, brush, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant, washcloth, shower caddy.
8. Two pair of comfortable shoes. Closed toe shoes are required for Recreation. Extra socks needed also.
9. Laundry bag, plastic bag for wet clothes
10. Sunscreen and Insect repellent
11. Flashlight
12. Pen or pencil, paper for camp mail & devotional notes
13. Dark t-shirts for recreation water games & water slide.
14. Fan, extension cord and power strip.
15. Senior Campers should bring a lawn chair for ball field devotional.
Note: If campers want to store luggage under their bunks, trunks or bins should be no more than 10 inches tall.

DO NOT BRING TO CAMP:

1. Money—campers will not need it.
2. Jewelry
3. Electronic devices (iPods, radios, electronic games, etc.)
4. Cell phones
5. Immodest clothing—campers will be asked to change.
6. Drugs, tobacco, alcohol, fireworks, knives, weapons

CAMP RULES

Campers: Please read and be familiar with these.

1. Love God with all your heart, soul, and mind.
2. Love your neighbor as yourself and practice the Golden Rule.
3. Everyone is required to follow the schedule.
4. All campers are expected to keep the camp clean and safe.
5. All campers are to be in cabins at lights-out time to make sure everyone gets enough rest.
6. Campers are not allowed to bring personal automobiles. Campers are not to leave camp without permission.
7. Girls' area is off limits to boys and boys' area is off limits to girls.
8. In keeping with our aim to honor all people, no pranks or cabin raids will be allowed.
9. Clothing should be loose, comfortable and appropriate for recreational activities. Shorts should be loose and no shorter than 4 inches above the knee (no bike shorts). Leggings are not to be substituted for pants. Shirts are to be loose and must come below the waist even when arms are raised. No sleeveless shirts. No shirts with ungodly messages or pictures. In the event that a camper wears clothing not appropriate for our camp, the camper will be asked to change. Alternative clothing will be available if necessary.
10. No form of tobacco, alcohol, drugs, fireworks, or weapons will be permitted by staff or campers.
11. Campers' medications are to be reported to the nurse at registration. PLEASE bring medication in original bottle.
12. The directors reserve the right to send any person home if necessary and such action would improve the camp. Under such circumstances, no refunds will be made.
13. No cell phones or electronic devices (radios, electronic games, iPods, MP3 players, etc.) are allowed. In the event that they are found, they will be taken up and given to the director. They will be given back at the end of camp.
